Explain the concept of environmental racism.

Environmental racism can be considered as a form of environmental injustice based on race or ethnic minority such as marginalised communities who face or are negatively exposed to environmental hazards, or who are disadvantaged by policies and practices that abuse their rights. Environmental injustice can be intentional or systemic. Intentional from planning or policy frameworks that are not enforced equitably or systemic in decision making that excludes minority groups to voice their concerns about natural resources. Therefore, development practitioners and natural resources managers and policy makers must take special measures to ensure that decisions on allocation of environmental benefits and costs do not unfairly disadvantage minority groups.

What is the role of environmental justice in sustainability?

Student's Answer:

Sustainability is considered to be achieved if interventions deliver better outcomes for people and nature. Environmental justice plays a key role in sustainability by ensuring that efforts to protect the environment and achieve economic growth are fair, inclusive and respond to the needs of all people in an equitable manner, especially marginalized community members. The role of environmental justice in sustainability can be categorized into 4: equitable or distributive justice, inclusive decision making or procedural justice; recognizing rights and knowledge, restorative justice. Equitable or distributive justice-ensure that environmental benefits and costs are distributed fairly Procedural justice-enables meaningful participation of affected communities and persons in decision making about land, natural resources, conservation and economic development investments. Recognition of rights and knowledge justice helps to ensure that rights, cultures and livelihoods and traditions of local communities and indigenous peoples are respected and considered in decision making. Restorative justice ensures that past and ongoing harms are acknowledged and measures are put in place to prevent them from recurring or escalating. Therefore, sustainable development decisions should reflect on whether development addresses inequalities in distributions of benefits and costs, facilitates inclusive participation, protects rights of marginalized groups and prevents environmental harm.
